The college bowl challenges students by asking them questions related to food science, food processing, food law, and general food trivia.


Students will now participate in the national competition in Chicago which will be held during the IFT Annual Conference held July 13-16.

Also, thank you to Dr. Chaves for mentoring these students. The success of these students is in part to your mentorship, guidance and leadership.



Congratulations to Car Reen Kok for being named the recipient Of the Global Prebiotics Association 2025 Your Researcher Award for Applied Research. This prestigious award recognized her outstanding paper, "Identification of Carbohydrate Gene Clusters Obtained from In Vitro Fermentations as Predictive Biomarkers of Prebiotic Responses, "published in BMC Microbiology.

Car's research was a collaborative effort, with co-authors Devin Rose, Juan Cui from Computer Science, Lisa Whisenhunt from the Nebraska Food for Heather Center (NFHC) and Bob Hutkins. The paper was funded in part by the NFHC, highlighting the importance in interdisciplinary collaboration in advancing scientific knowledge.

Car Reen's academic journey began at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL), where she earned her B.S. in Biochemistry. She then joined Dr. Hutkins' lab for her M.S. in food science and her Ph.D. in Complex Biosystems. Her dedication and hard work have led her to her current role as a staff scientist at Lawrence Livermore National Lab.

We are incredibly proud of Car's achievements and look forward to seeing her continued contributions to the field.


