BB GUN/AIR RIFLE NEW SHOOTER CLINIC

Who: This clinic is for Otoe County 4-H members, ages 8-18, NEWLY enrolled in the air rifle and/or bb gun project area(s) who have not previously participated in our regular season or fair contest. One adult is required per household to assist their 4-H member/s. Space is limited.

What: All youth should have general knowledge of how their bb gun operates before the clinic. This clinic will focus on:

- range safety & commands
- prone, standing, sitting, & kneeling shooting positions
- competition target procedures/rules

When: Sunday, April 13, 2025; 4 p.m.

Where: Kimmel Arena, Syracuse, NE (northwest entrance)

Requirements: Enrolled in Otoe County 4-H & the bb gun or air rifle project areas.

What to bring:

- BB gun/air rifle UNLOADED
- Safety glasses (we have glasses)
- kneeling mat OR old carpet strip (2ft x 3ft works great!)
- binoculars (close range binoculars see details @ 15 35 feet)
- lawn chair OR portable stool (for adult helper)
 wear close-toed shoes -NO sandals, flip flops, ETC.
- Ammo is PROVIDED
